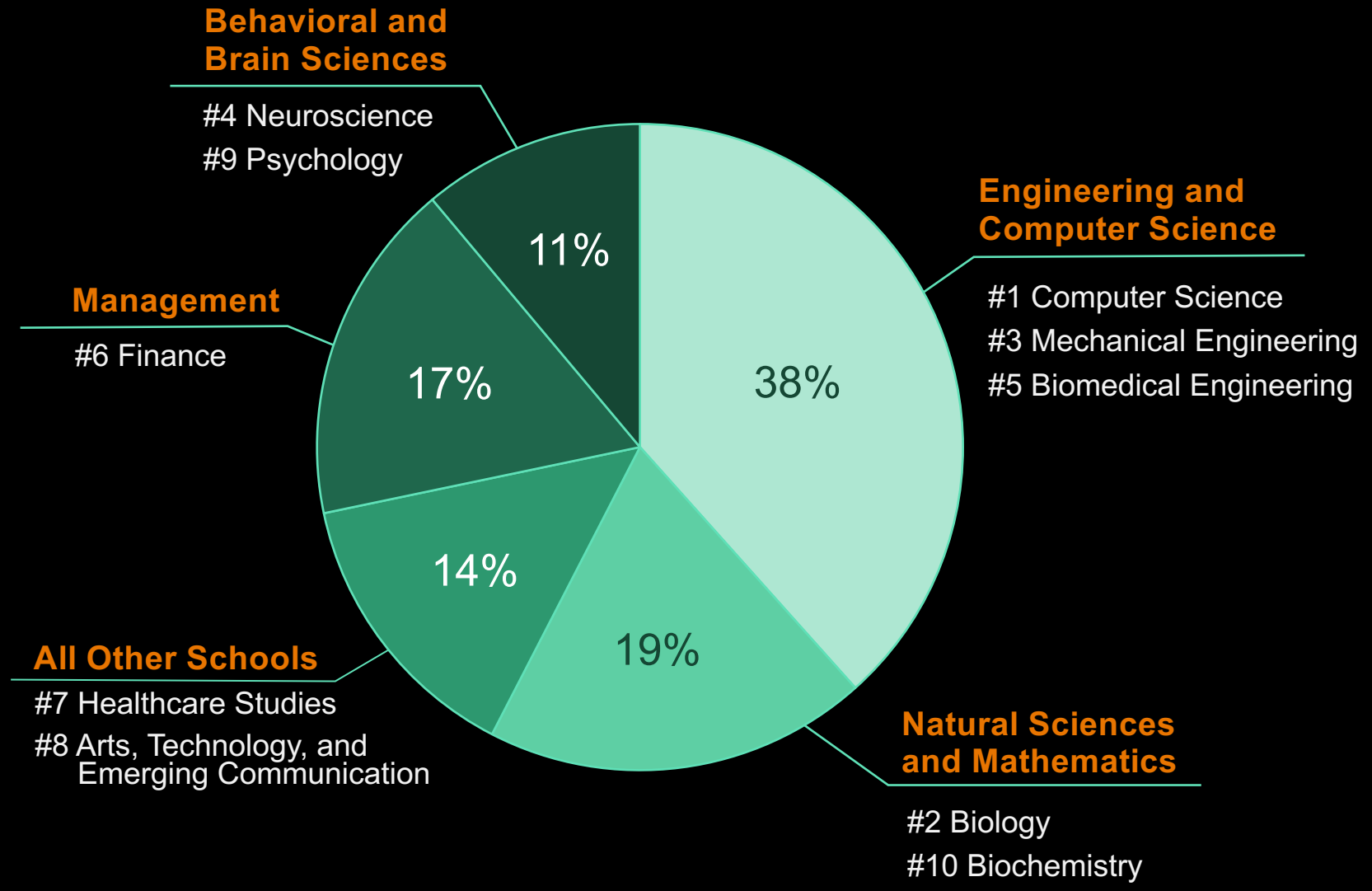

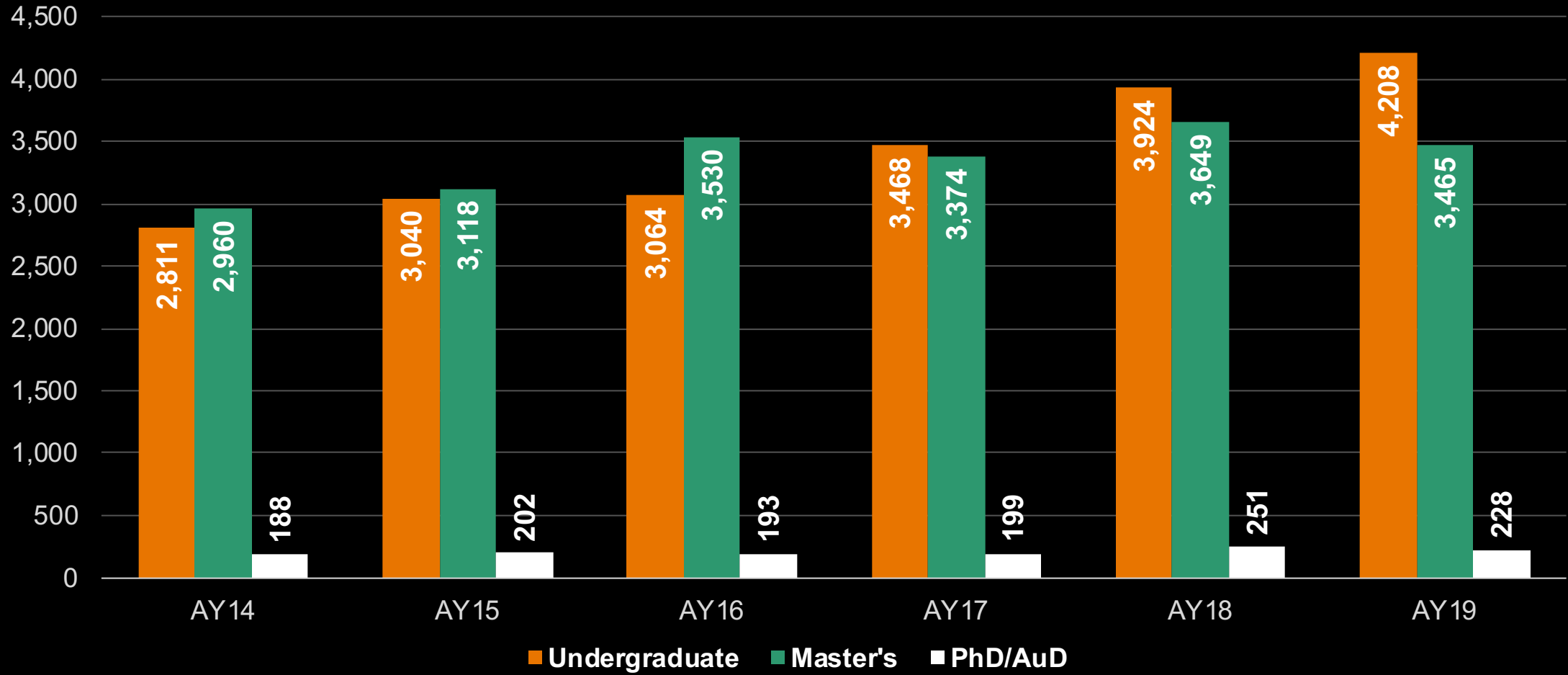


Top Declared Majors of Full-Time Incoming Freshmen



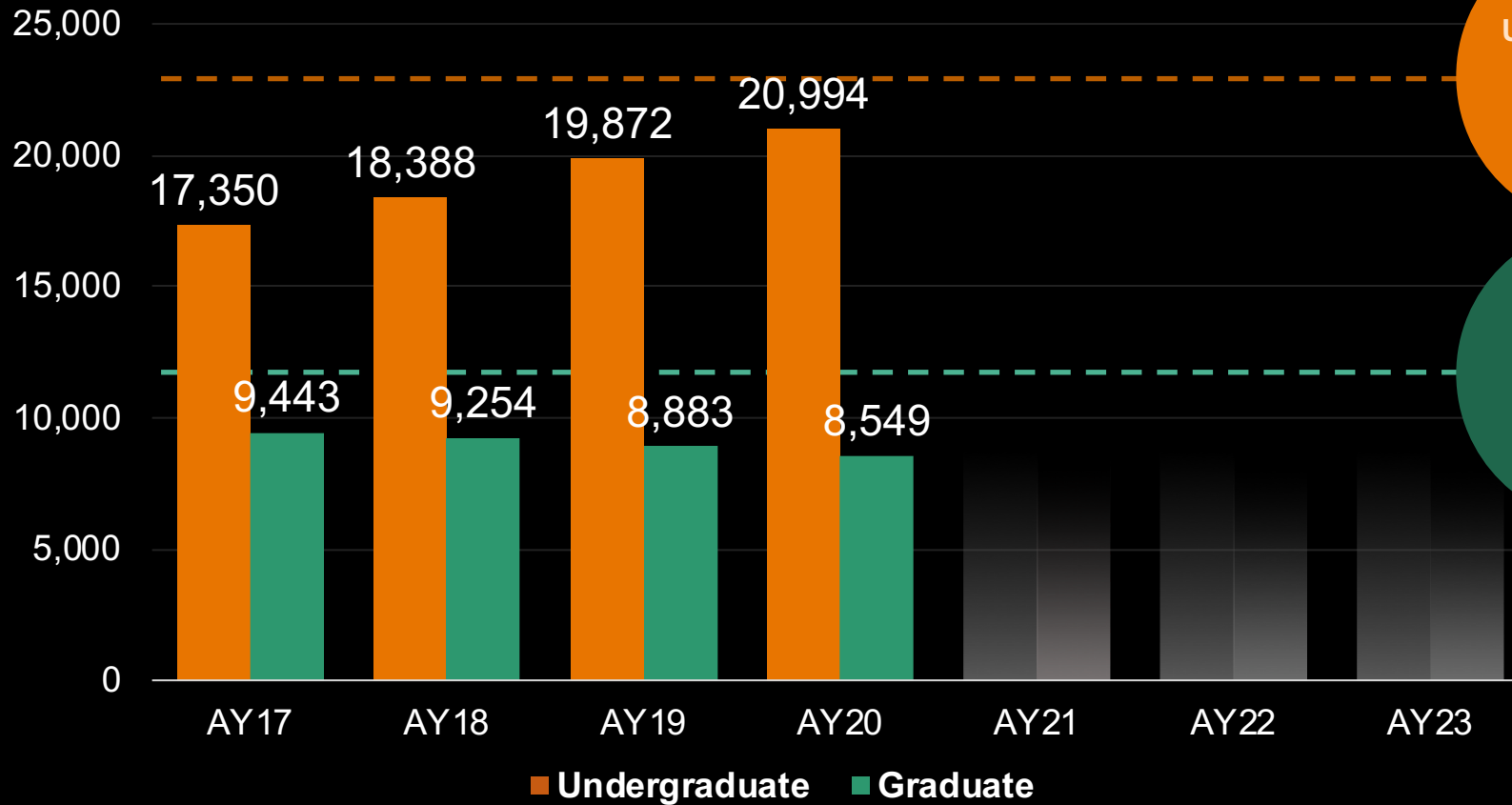


Degrees Awarded by Academic Year

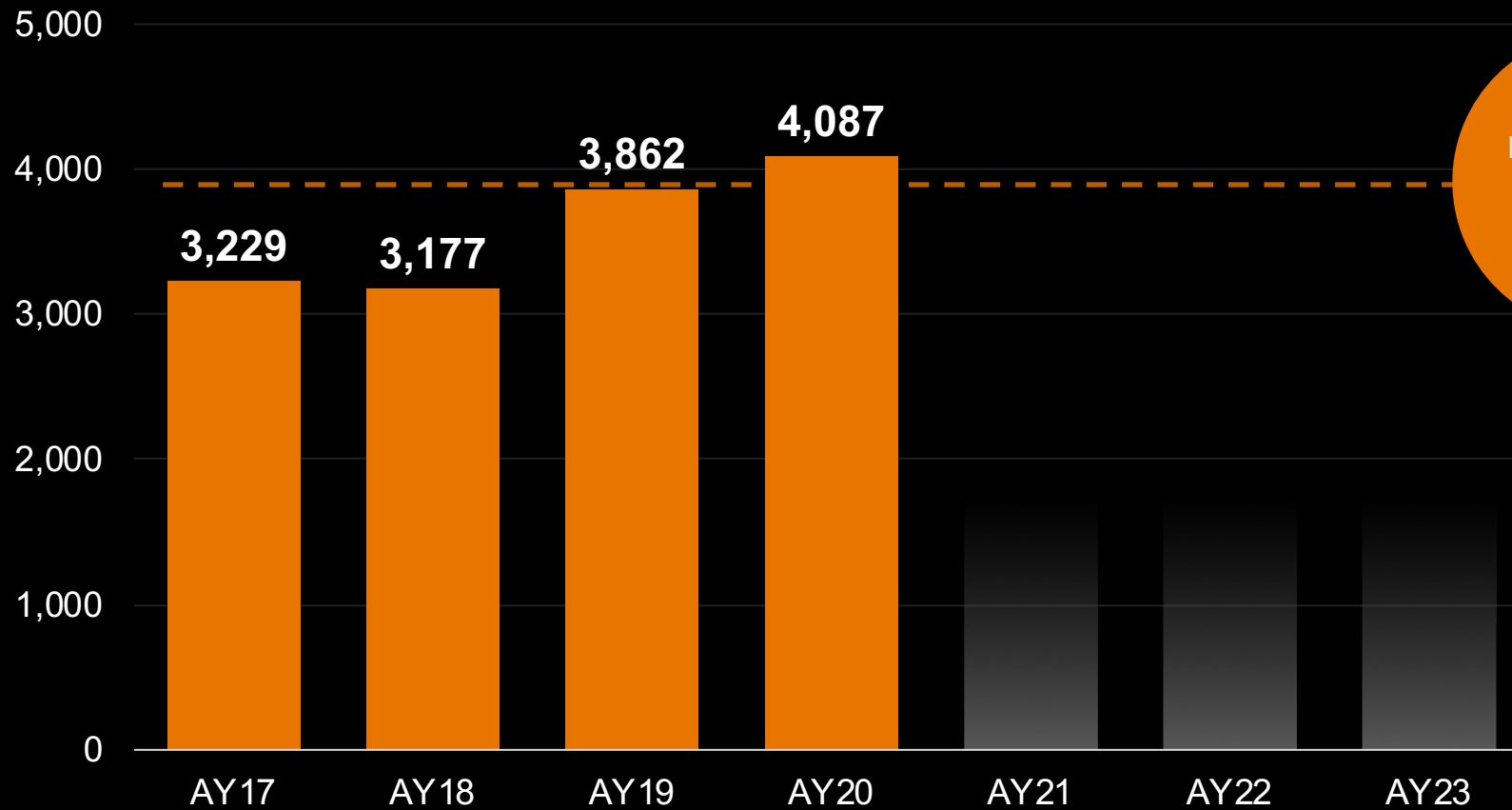

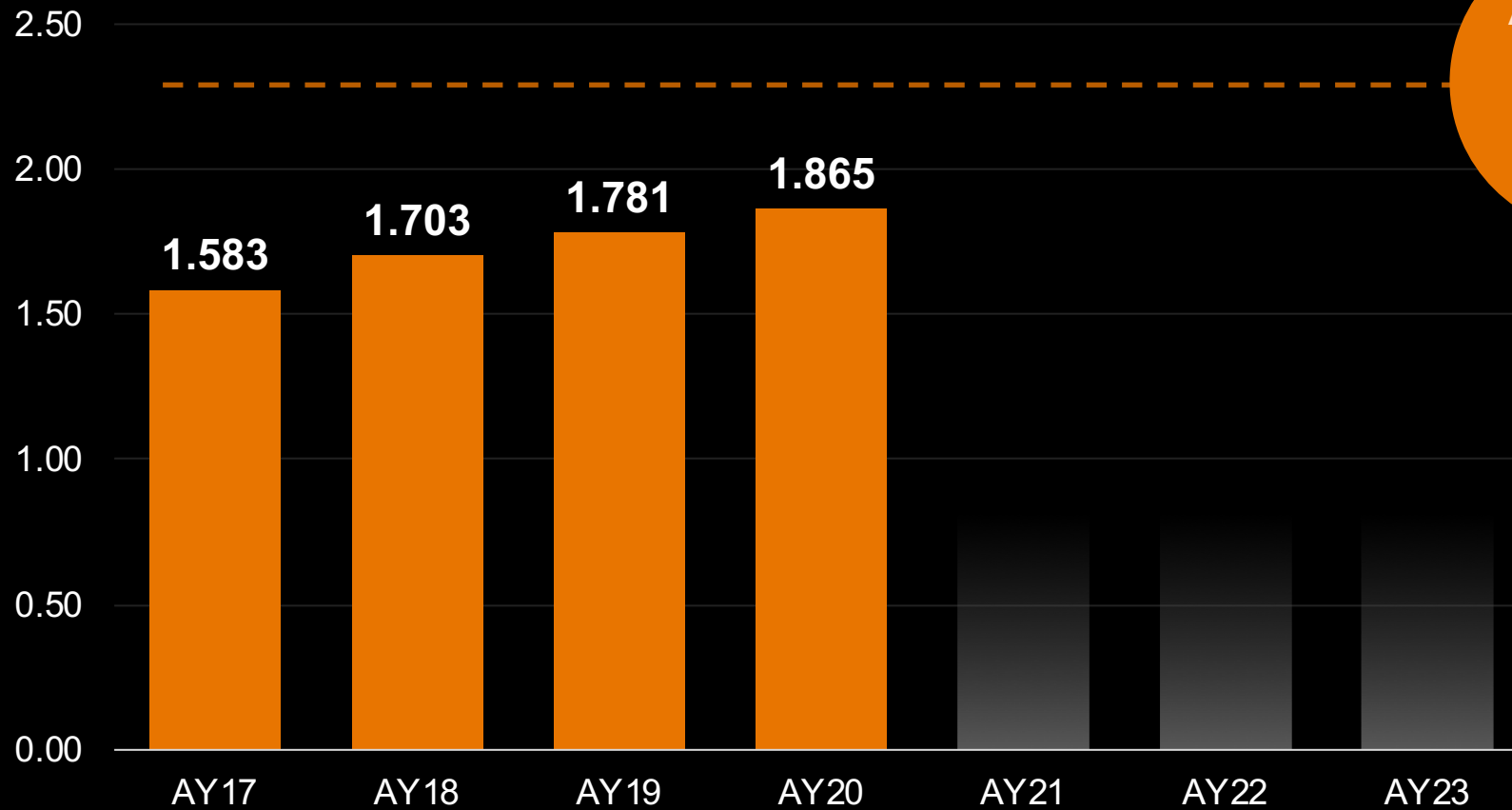

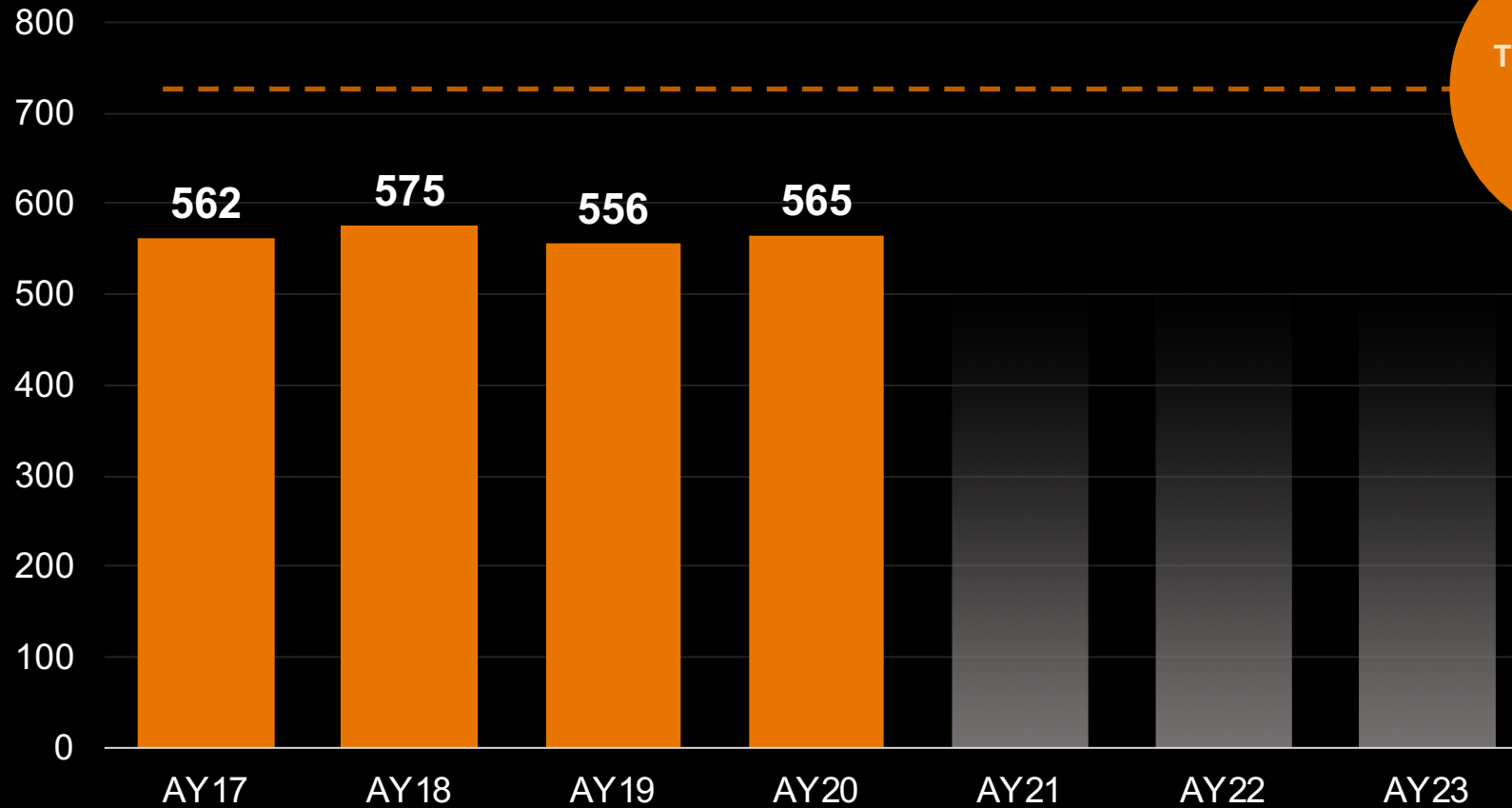

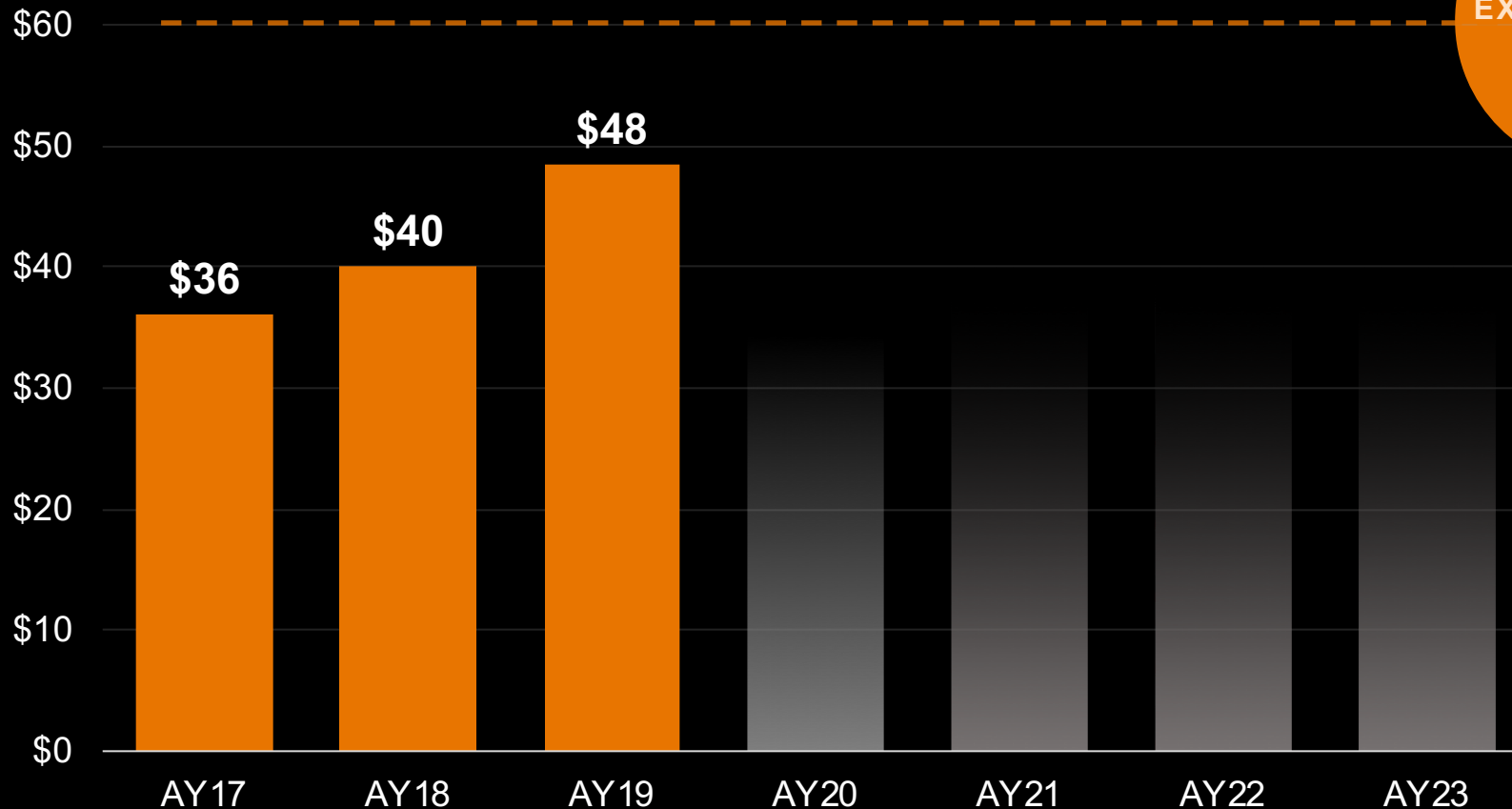

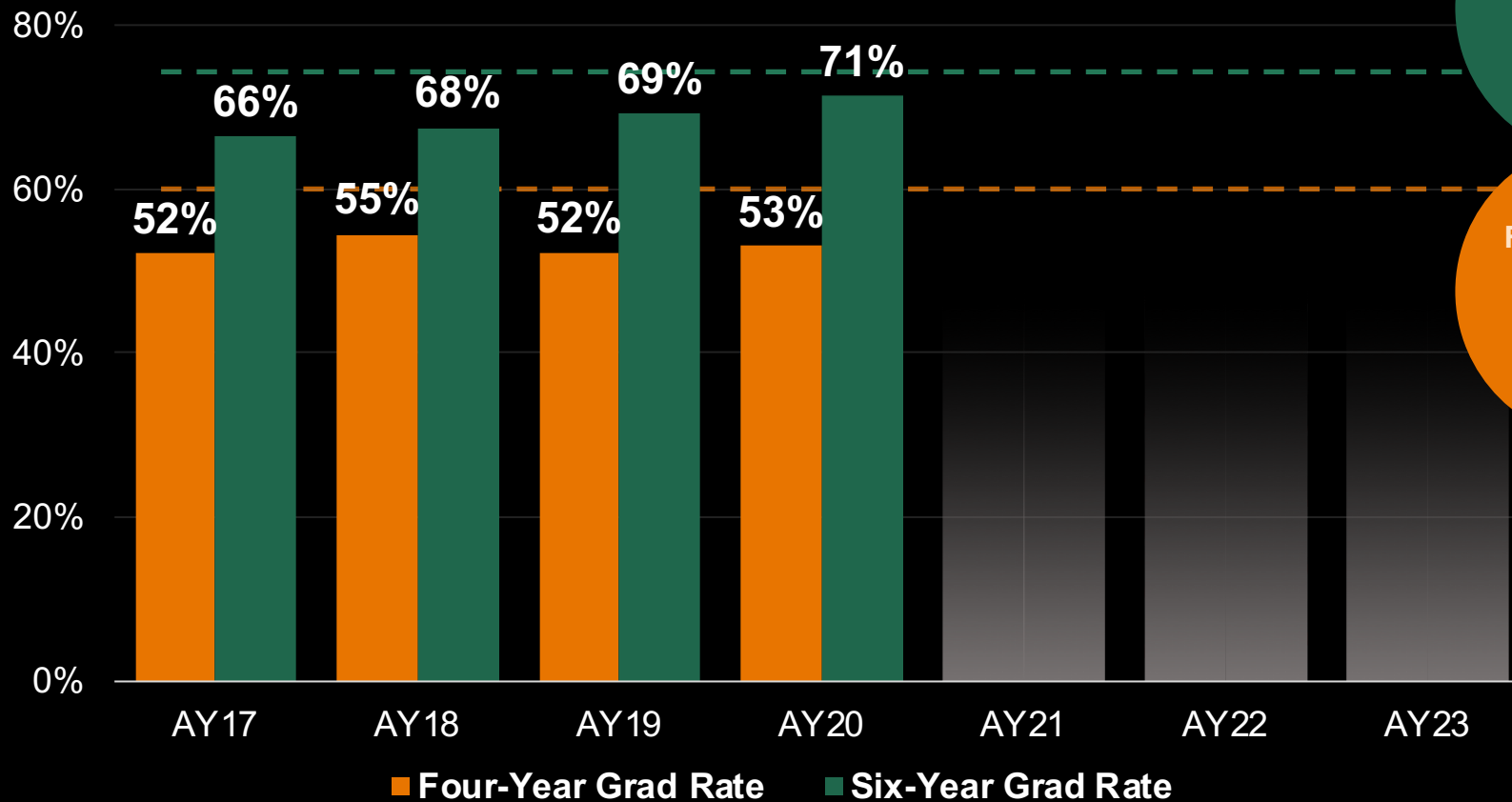

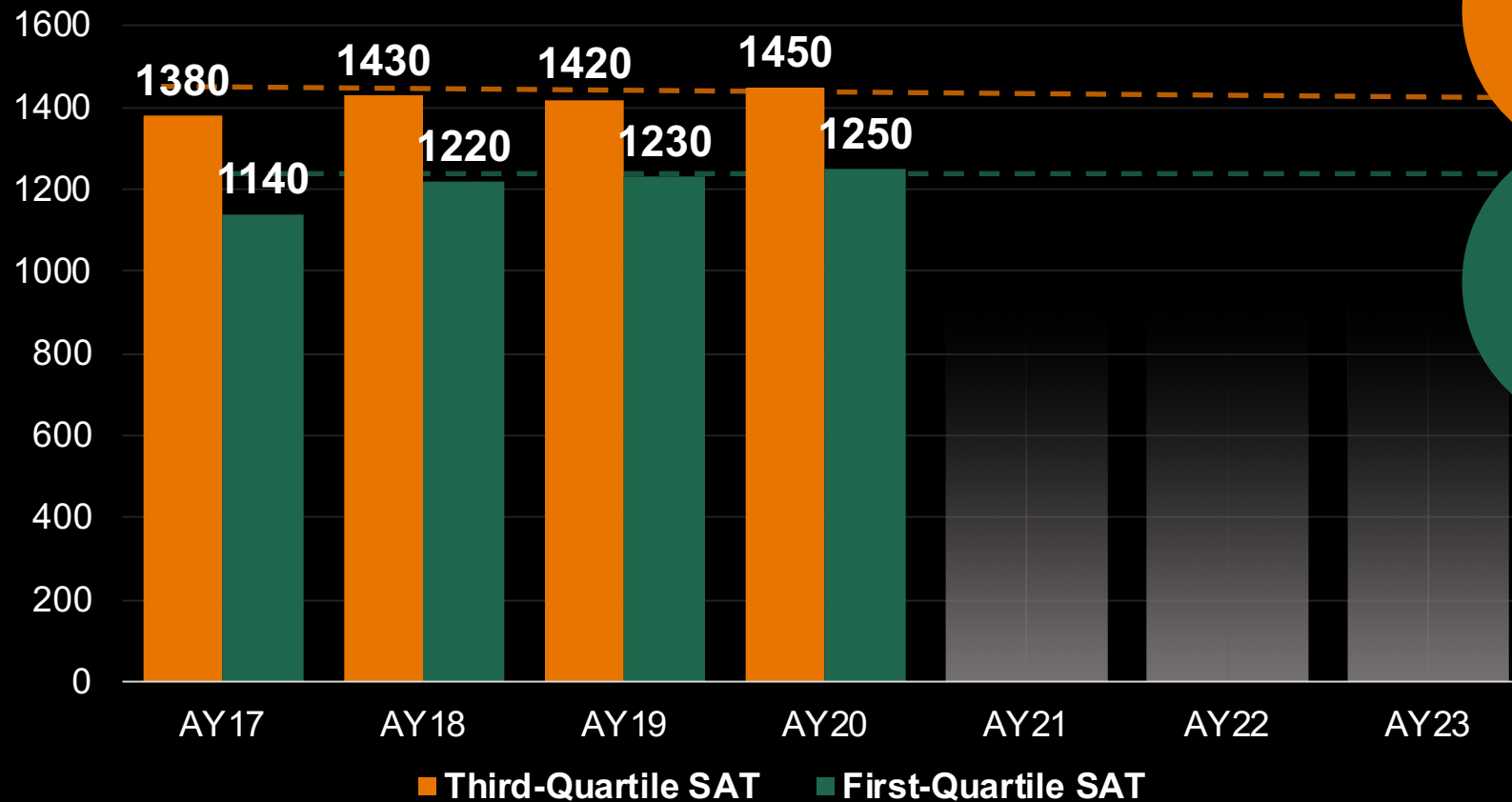

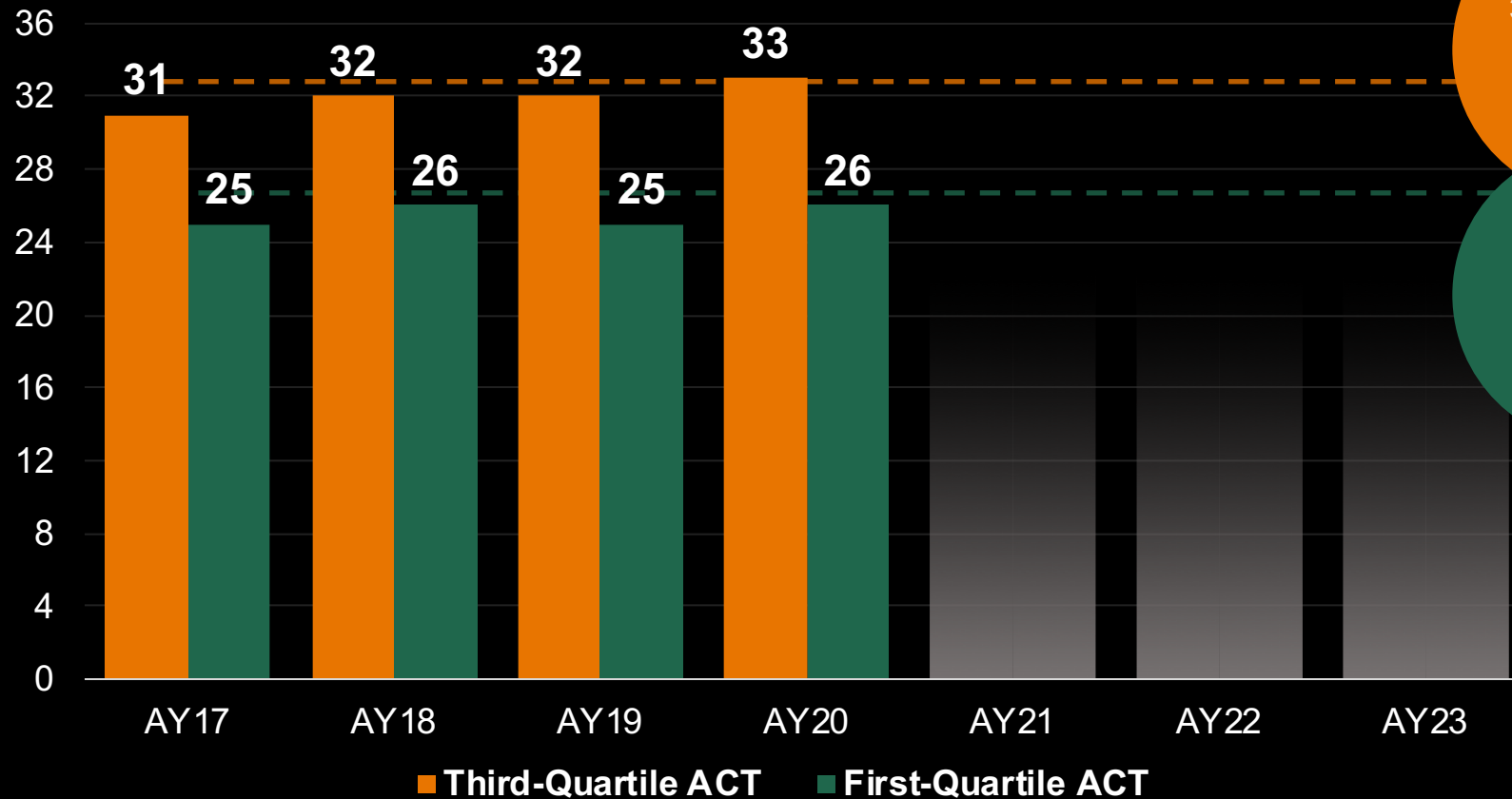

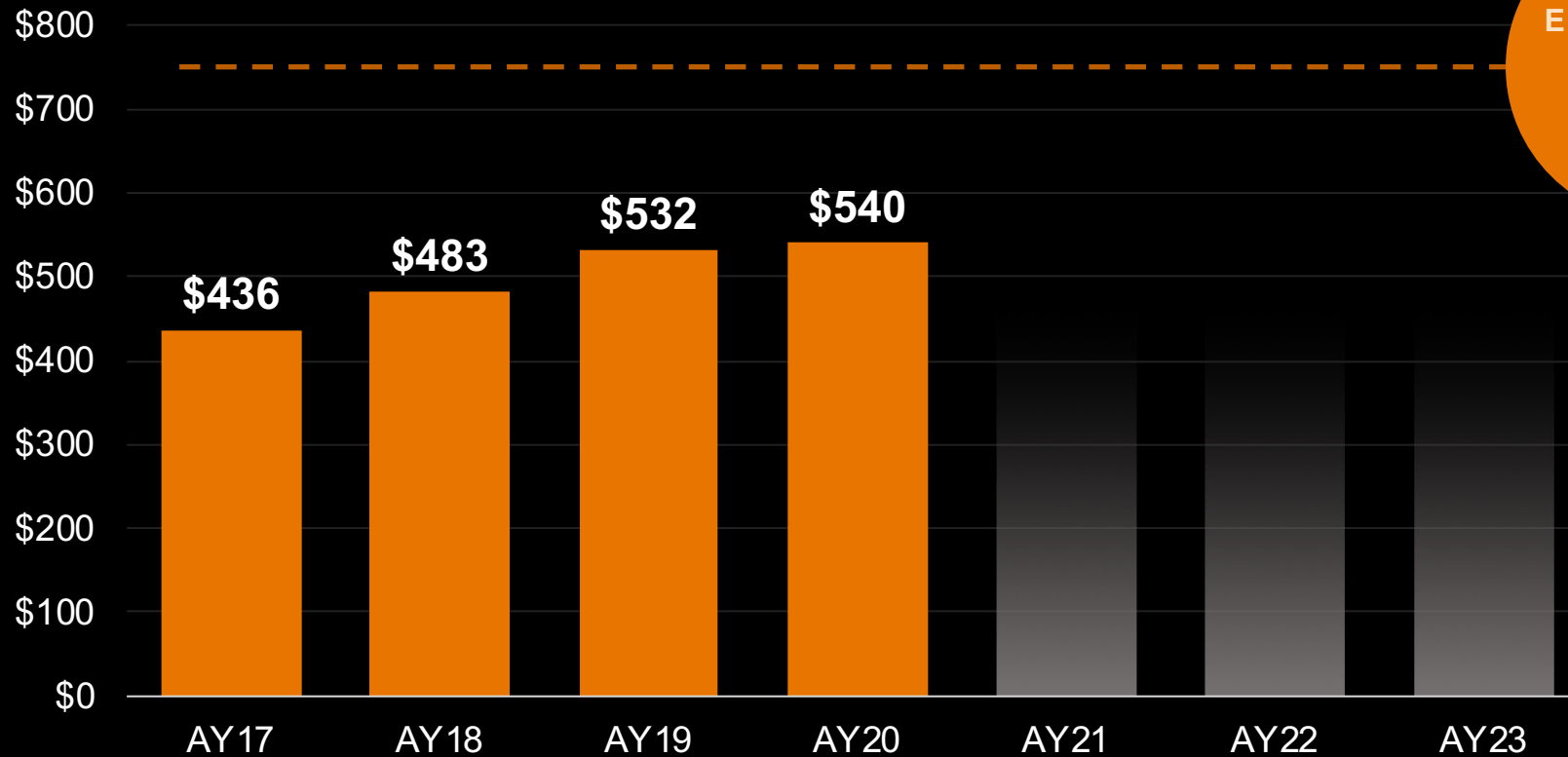
